

Spelling Words R-Influenced Vowel Patterns - *ire, ier*

Generalization: / combines with r to create r-influenced sounds and patterns. The *ire* and *ier* patterns come at the end of a word and represent the long / sound. Words that end in *ier* often have base words that end in y (cry -> crier).

<u>ire</u>	<u>ier</u>
hire	crier
tired	flier
fire	frier
spire	pliers
umpire	drier
expire	shier

<u>Generalization</u>: The <u>ea</u> pattern in CVVC words sometimes spells short <u>e</u>.

Spelling Words

Unaccented Final Syllables - en, on, an, ain

<u>Generalization</u>: The unaccented final syllable /en/ may be spelled different ways, but *-en* is the most common.

<u>-en</u>	<u>-on</u>	<u>-an</u>	<u>-ain</u>
