Spelling Words Patterns and Sound with *IE* and *EI*

Generalization: The vowel pair combinations of *i* and *e* can be confusing. The pair *ei* spells long a. The pair *ie* can spell long i or long e, but position matters. If *ie* is in the middle of a word, it makes the long e sound.

Generalization: r-influenced u is much like r-influenced o. It has a variety of patterns but usually the same sound.

Word Endings - y, ey, ie

<u>Generalization</u>: The long e sound in a final syllable may be spelled -y, -ey, or -ie. The spelling -ey comes after k, l, or n. When y is in an accented final syllable, it spells the long i sound.
