R-Influenced Vowel Patterns - er, ear, eer

<u>Generalization</u>: e combines with r to create r-influenced sounds and patterns. Some er words have homophones that sound the same but are spelled differently.

Challenge Word: cheerleader

Spelling Words Long O - CVCe, CVVC-oa, CVV-ow, VCC-o

Generalization: Long o can be spelled in a variety of patterns: o-e, oa, ow, and o. When long o is at the end of a word, it is usually spelled with ow.

Spelling Words

Final Syllables - ture, sure, ure

<u>Generalization:</u> when a final syllable is spelled *-ture*, it sounds like /chur/. When it is spelled *-sure*, it sounds like /zhur/. When it is spelled *-ure*, it can sound like /yur/.
