



Snow Globe Book Report

Due: December 12th

For the November/December book report, you will be creating a snow globe to tell about the book you read!

Cover Page: Create a NEW cover for your book! Think about your favorite part, the characters, and/or setting to help you create the cover. Please do not just copy the cover of your book, make it new and exciting!

Setting: Describe the setting of your book. Make sure to use complete sentences!

Summaries: Write summaries to tell about the beginning, middle, and end of your book. Summaries should be 2 – 3 sentences and tell the big ideas, not specific details. Here are example summaries for a book we read in class called George's Marvelous Medicine.

Beginning: *George decides to make Granny a new medicine that will cure her crankiness. He uses items he can find in his house and on the farm.*

Middle: *When George gives the concoction to Granny, she grows taller than the house. George also gives his new medicine to the animals on their farm, and they all grow huge.*

End: *George runs out of medicine and makes a new batch, but he doesn't get the recipe right. When Granny accidentally drinks it, she disappears!*

Next: Think about what your characters might do after the story is over. Will they celebrate their accomplishments or set out on a new adventure? You get to decide!

Rating: How would you rate your book? Use a complete sentence to tell why you gave it that rating.

Assemble: Cut out each snow globe page and staple them together at the top.

At this point in the year, I encourage students to read chapter books (graphic novels with chapters work too). There are a lot of great chapter books for all reading levels. Here are some recommendations:

Easier Chapter Books: *Hey Jack!, Billie B Brown, Amelia Bedelia, Horrible Harry*

Grade-Level Chapter Books: *A to Z Mysteries, Magic Tree House, Cam Jansen, Hidden Scrolls, Encyclopedia Brown, Bad Kitty chapter books, Dragon Masters*
