## A Cool Hotel!

In a tiny village in Lapland, Sweden, you can find one of the "coolest" buildings in the world. It is the Ice Hotel, a hotel made of ice and snow!

Workers begin to construct the Ice Hotel every October. They use snow and ice from the frozen Torne River. The builders call this cold mixture "snice."



#### **A Cold Welcome**

By December the hotel is ready for guests. The lobby is filled with beautiful ice sculptures, and even the guest rooms are decorated with ice art. There is an auditorium for watching films and a special room for people who want to get married. The walls, floors, ceilings, and beds are all made of ice! There's no need for ice cubes to keep drinks cool here. That's because the glasses are made of ice, too!

Believe it or not, more than 120 people sleep in the Ice Hotel each night. They are given sleeping bags and reindeer skins to help them stay warm. That's important, since temperatures in the hotel rooms often drop below zero. During the day hotel guests can go ice fishing, ride snowmobiles, or learn how to carve ice.


#### **Closed for the Season**

Lapland is near the North Pole. That means winter there is long and cold. Because of the icy weather, the Ice Hotel stays open until April. But in May or June, the sun begins to warm things up, and the hotel disappears. It melts back into the Torne River. It will be back the following year, as magnificent as ever!
