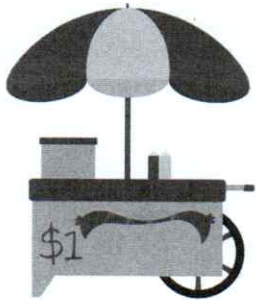

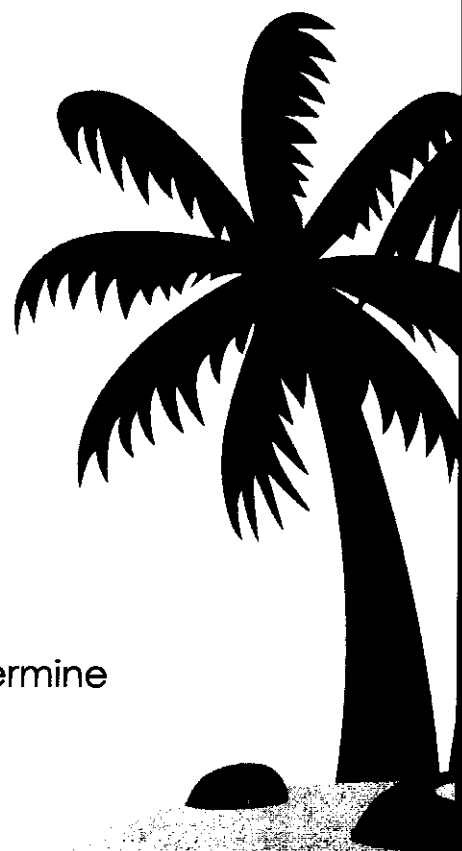
You had fun at the beach, but sadly your vacation has come to an end. Before your family leaves, they must check out of the beach house and pay the final bill.

It cost \$96.60 per night to rent the beach house. If your family stayed in the beach house for 5 nights, how much do they owe?

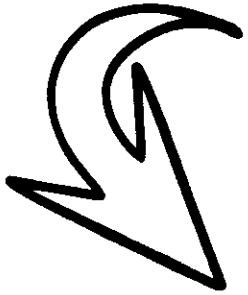
During your stay at the beach house, your family rented three movies that were \$1.99 each and one movie that was \$3.99. How much will your family owe in movie rental fees?

There was a \$12.84 charge on the bill for renting beach towels. If you rented 6 beach towels, what was the cost to rent just one beach towel?

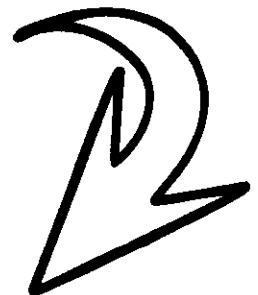

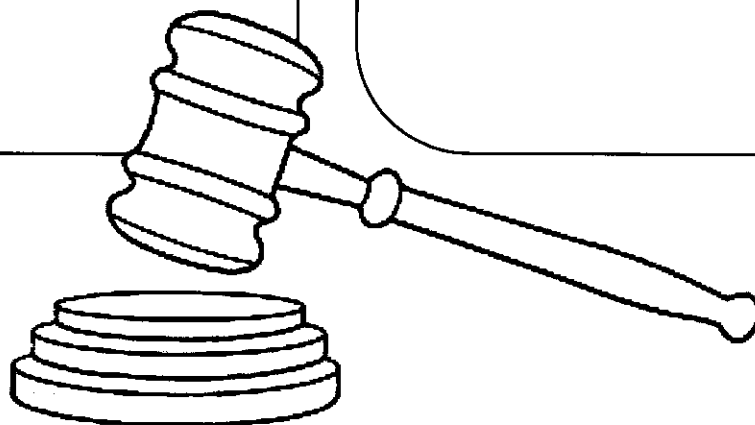

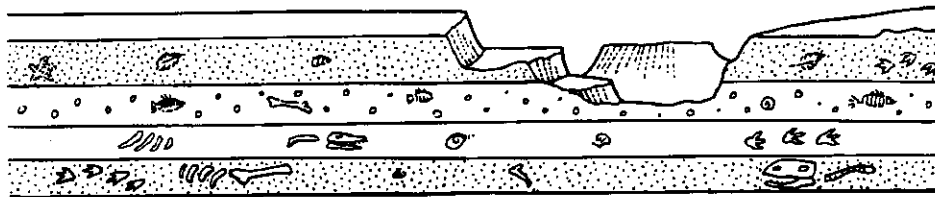


Weekly Question

Where is the best place to look for fossils?

Rock made from sediment is called **sedimentary rock**. As layers of sediment build up over millions of years, the top layers press down on the bottom layers. This pressure turns the layers into rock. Sandstone, limestone, and shale are all types of sedimentary rock.

Sedimentary rocks contain many fossils because the remains of plants and animals become trapped in layers of sediment. As new layers of sediment are added, these layers protect and **preserve** the covered remains.

Fossils are on every continent. They are actually easy to find because most of the rock we see is sedimentary rock. We find fossils when we dig up the rock or when the rock **erodes** and reveals buried layers.

Scientists who study fossils are called **paleontologists**. When paleontologists find a fossil that they want to study, they use special tools to remove the layers of sedimentary rock from around the fossil. The paleontologists must be careful because fossils can be damaged easily.

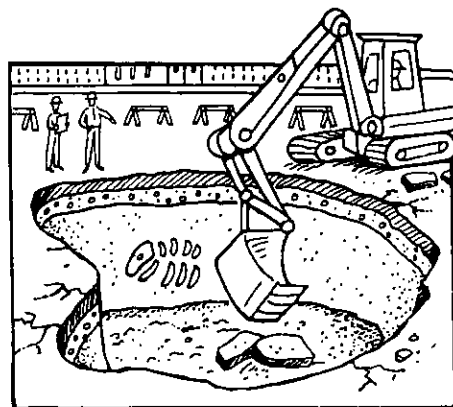
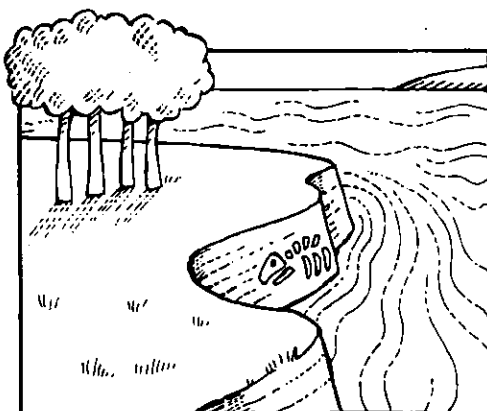
