Syllable Juncture (VCV and VCCV Patterns)

Generalization: An *open syllable* ends with a vowel that has a long-vowel sound. A closed syllable ends with a consonant and has a short-vowel sound. Double consonants in the middle of a word make the first syllable closed with a short vowel sound.
