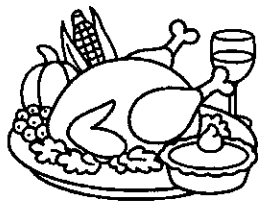

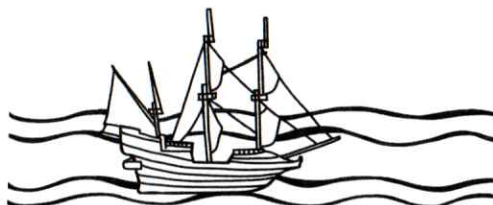

New England Colonies



The Puritans

Many people in New England were English Puritans. The Puritans came over to the New World in search of religious freedom. They believed the Church of England was too powerful. When they tried to change it, they were outcast. They sailed across the Atlantic Ocean in hopes of building a new community of their own. In time, thousands of Puritans arrived in the Massachusetts Bay Colony. They spread inland and settled up and down along the Atlantic coast.

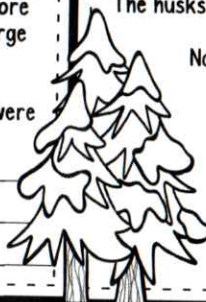
Life in the New England Colonies was tough! The colonists depended completely on the natural resources in the area. They used the lumber to build their homes and they ate fish and the few crops they could grow there.

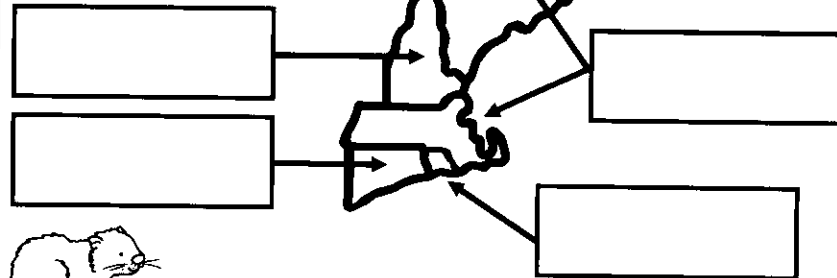

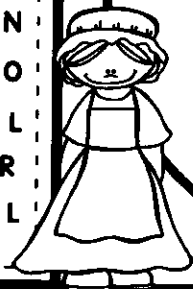

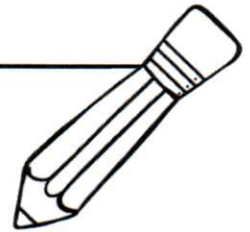
