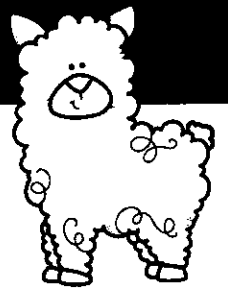

Word Endings - dge / ge

Generalization: Words in English do not end with the letter *j*. Instead the final sound is spelled with *ge* or *dge* and the *e* softens the *g*. Use *dge* after a short vowel and *ge* after a long vowel. When the *j* sound comes after *l*, *r*, or *n*, it is always spelled with *ge*.
